Vision - a rewards system which...

- supports, acknowledges and validates all steps taken by students to be the best that they can be.
- underpins the school motto 'Nil Satis Optimum' (only the best is good enough)
- supports the teachings of our Patron Saint 'Preach the Gospel at all times, use words if necessary' and the notion that our actions outweigh our words.
- reinforces, in the words of Bishop Kelly of Liverpool the idea that 'Education is about formation not information' emphasising our responsibility as Teachers to form the whole person.
- empowers students to recognise and understand the importance of demonstrating the 15 St Francis of Assisi virtues to better themselves as individuals and in so doing, support and enhance the life of our school community
- prepares our students to be valued citizens for the future.
- places Christ at the centre of all we do.

The St Francis of Assisi rewards system is based on the Jesuit Pupil Profile. This was created in Jesuit schools to promote, recognise and reward the many behaviours which serve to form the whole person. These behaviours or virtues help individuals to make the most of their God-given

talents and abilities and to help, serve and benefit others. At St Francis of Assisi, we aim to reward students each day, who demonstrate any of the 16 of these virtues. In so doing, we are helping them to prepare to be the Saints that God calls us all to be. The virtues can be loosely divided into academic behaviours and moral/spiritual behaviours. The virtues are included in the picture opposite. The design of a tree shows how, as we use these virtues, we grow to be the person that God wants us to be. We aim to be valued members of the Saint Francis of Assisi community. We aim to become valued members of society and ultimately to be Saints, as we strive to take up the place in Heaven that God has set aside for us, by making the right choices while on earth.
