As the term develops, it is still great to see students working so hard, and working with us to keep everyone safe. Every lesson starting with the sign of the cross and a formal welcome is a great way to start the learning but also keep our Faith at the heart of all we do.

I would like to reiterate the message that I strongly encourage face coverings in communal areas such as corridors, and must insist on face coverings on buses to try and keep everyone safe. Parental support with these measures is greatly received.

After a successful and safe launch of the canteen service after the Summer we are in a position to increase the food offer to a 'Hot service' as of Monday 28th September. The 'Meal Deal' price will still be in place but we recognise that as the days get a little colder, a warm service is a positive step and the safe, 'grab and go' service is embedded.

Finally, keeping students safe is of the upmost importance, not just in the times of Covid. A growing concern is that of vehicles parking inappropriately in and around school or using the entrance/ exit to school as a turning bay. In terms of parking, I ask that the relevant road markings are adhered to and that we are all considerate of the local residents and them being able to access their property. In terms of turning in the slip roads in to or out of school, I am afraid this is an extremely dangerous practice and puts the safety of students at risk. Please follow the one way system at all times.
