## Year 11 Results Day

Results Day for Year 11 will be hosted at St Francis of Assisi on the Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> August. This is much earlier date than in a usual year. Despite the likely relaxation of Covid restrictions we are keen to provide a safe experience for students and staff when collecting results and as a result arrangements will differ from a 'normal' year.

Below you will find information regarding the organisation of the day and we ask parents and students to take careful note of the arrangements. Information about how results have been calculated and the appeals process should you be unhappy with the process can be found on the school website.

### GCSE Results Day for Year 11 is on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> August 2020

If students are not available to collect results on the 12<sup>th</sup> August they should provide a stamped, self-addressed envelope so that results can be posted home. Due to the current climate we will not be allowing people to collect results on behalf of students.

Only Year 11 students will be allowed into the school building to collect results. Should parents/ carers wish to accompany students then I ask that you remain outside of the Green exterior gates, unless you drive on to the school site where I ask that you remain in your vehicle. All of this is to limit the number of people that staff and Y11s come into contact with.

Results will be given out in the Sports Hall and the Gym Hall and students will be asked to come at specific times. Once again, the aim is to limit contact.

The school site will be open at 9:00am

Results will be distributed according to the initial letter of surnames.

If students arrive before their time we will not be in a position to hand out their results. Any student who cannot make their time will need to collect their results between 11.00 and 12.00.

Any year Y12 or Y13 student resitting GCSE exams should collect their results between 11.00 and 12.00 from the Sports Hall.

The number of students in the Halls at any one time will be limited as entrance into the building will be controlled by a member of staff.

There will be a one-way system within the Halls so as to best limit contact with others.

After collecting results, we ask that parents and students do not remain on the school premises longer than necessary.

This is a very different results day in many ways and even this letter does not allow for the usual celebratory tone we would all prefer. However, we believe that we must continue to act with caution and must continue to act in a way that minimises the chances for disruption to all members of the school community.
