








REPORT TO A CENTRE ON MODERATED WORK



exploring the practical handling of the camera and sophisticated post-editing techniques with physical and digital image manipulation. Location shooting, including Birmingham city centre as well as other local areas, extended opportunities to record and refine as work developed. Technical skill was evident in the work of all candidates and was sophisticated in the upper mark range. Candidates in the sample had presented personal responses which took urverse forms, for example, candidates exploring internal elements of computers were transformed into townscapes. Videos and photographs of 'dancing' liquids on a speaker cone demonstrated a confident critical and contextual understanding related to their chosen theme and the development of initial ideas.

Communication of ideas were demonstrated in widely varied Related Study topics for example on subjects such as 'How can portraiture be used to express emotion', 'The use of colour and lighting in illustrating childhood' and 'Do black and white images create a more meaningful image in street photography'. Suitably narrow topics have allowed for in-depth study where evidence of insightful exploration along with an extensive and well-considered use of specialist language was found in the work of candidates in the higher mark range. In the mid to high mark range, informed exploration, purposeful use of specialist language and vocabulary with well-developed understanding is demonstrated when realising intentions. Bibliographies were a positive factor in all submissions.




