Please note, this session is for Parents/Carers of Autistic Young People and FE Professions.

The options after year 11 and year 13 can sometimes be confusing for learners and for parents/carers. There are many different routes and pathways that young people can take, and choices must be carefully made. Preparing for adulthood should be considered as part of their education to support young people into adulthood with paid employment, good health, independent living and friends, relationships, and community inclusion. This course explores these 4 areas and how educational settings can promote and embed these principles into their individual learning plans and EHC Plan targets.

# Self-Harm

This course has been developed to support an understanding of self-harm and the prevalence in Autistic young people. Discussed is the difference between self-harm and self-injury, identifying common triggers, signs that a child/young person may be self-harming and effective strategies/interventions to try. Signposting to organisations that can assist is explored in this training.
