About Short Breaks in Walsall

Walsall Council is pleased to announce the programmes of Short Breaks taking place in the summer school holiday, Tuesday 23 July – Friday 16 August 2024.

Short Breaks can benefit the whole family. They provide opportunities for children and young people with a disability to spend time away from their families, relax, develop new friendships, take part in new experiences, and have fun doing positive activities. They also give families a break from their caring responsibilities, a chance to rest or spend time with their other children.

We recognise that all families are different and will need different levels of support and different types of Short Breaks; therefore, we ensure that there is a wide range of Short Breaks to meet those needs.

Short breaks are part of the support for an 'Ordinary Life' as set out in the Children and Families Act 2014. We want young people to be healthy, safe, achieve, make a positive contribution, have supportive friends and families and benefit from economic well being.

Eligibility

To access targeted School Holiday activities, children and young people should:

- be aged from 8 to 17 years old (up to their 18th birthday)
- live in Walsall.
- have a diagnosed disability.
- be in receipt of disability living allowance (DLA)

Please note: **An up-to-date short breaks passport** (reviewed and updated within the last 12 months) is required for each child to access Short Break services, to ensure we have the right information for the planning of activities and support for our children and young people. We are unable to allocate places for children and young people at the holiday schemes without an updated short breaks passport.

This booklet contains details of when and where the activities are, who they are suitable for and an overview of what they involve.

Instructions - How to Express an Interest in a Short Break

- 1. Please read the short breaks booklet and choose an activity provider that best meets the child's age and particular needs and interests. Only one activity provider will be allocated for each young person.
- 2. Deadline for Expression of Interests (EOI) 12 noon on Friday 7 June 2024
- 3. We need an up-to-date short breaks passport to allow access to the service. Please send one to the short breaks' mailbox by 12 noon on Friday 7 June 2024. The passport ensures the right support is in place to support our families. They are to be reviewed with families each year, although they can be updated at any time if you need to make changes. The passports also help staff at the club to plan activities.

- 5. The club manager will email or phone families' week commencing 24 June 2024 with dates for SUMMER informing them of the provider they have been allocated to, and the date(s) their child can attend. The number of sessions offered depends on the demand for places. We ask for a second choice of club, as demand for some clubs may be higher than others.
- 6. Please wait to be offered dates from chosen club. If you have not heard about your **SUMMER dates** by **Friday 28 June 2024**, please contact Shortbreaks@walsall.gov.uk
- 7. Once a child has been given an offer of a short break, the parent/carer of the child must email or send a text to the club manager to confirm that the child will be attending the place for **SUMMER** by **Monday 1 July 2024.**

If confirmation is not sent, the place will be offered to another young person.

- 4. Wait to be offered dates from chosen club. (If you have not heard about your **SUMMER** dates by **Friday 28 June 2024**, please contact Shortbreaks@walsall.gov.uk
- 5. Confirm your child's attendance at club by **Monday 1 July 2024** otherwise, dates will be offered to another child.
- 6. Any cancellations should be made as soon as possible but must be at least 48hrs before start of club.
- 7. Please note that if you are unable to attend, can you let us know in advance as the place can be offered to another child who needs support.
- 8. Please call the activity co-ordinator directly as soon as you know you will not be needing the place. We have a high number of children and young people who would like to attend the short breaks holiday activities, they can be offered your place if you are not able to attend.

My Place, Walstead Road West, Walsall

My Place is a youth centre that is accessible for wheelchair users and provides a safe and secure environment for young people.

The holiday provision is managed by experienced youth service staff that are trained and have the competencies to provide support and care for young people with a wide range of needs including those with complex health care needs.

This includes medical assistance, the monitoring and administering of diabetes injections, peg feeding and with all personal care needs. There are changing facilities including a shower, changing bed and an electric hoist.

Activities are offered on an individual needs basis with young people engaging in their choice of activity. All activities are designed to promote young people's social skills and emotional well-being. They are adapted for all young people to engage in.

Resources for Autism provide practical services for children and adults with an autistic spectrum condition and for their families and carers.

Our playscheme offer young people an opportunity to engage in meaningful and fun based activities, i.e. cooking, sports, and group games, outdoor play, arts and crafts, sensory and water play, trips out etc.

All staff and volunteers are autism trained and services are designed to be welcoming and accepting of users whatever their level of need and support.

For our Short Breaks holiday schemes, we provide both indoor and outdoor activities which include:

Each session includes a breakfast club and, where possible, children are supported by the same member of staff for each of the days they attend during that holiday.
