

Entry Requirements:

For students to access our Sixth Form they must achieve an Average Points Score (APS) of 4.5 or above at GCSE level in their best five subjects.

Students who achieve an <u>APS between 4.5-5</u> in their best five subjects will be directed in their subject choices under the guidance of the Senior Leadership Team / Head of Sixth Form.

Student who achieve an <u>APS of 5 and above</u> in their best five subjects will be able to select any Level 3 courses (A Level / Vocational). Students will receive guidance from the Senior Leadership Team / Head of Sixth Form when making their choices.

Students who achieve an <u>APS of 7.5 and above</u> in their best five subjects will be eligible to study four subjects but will receive guidance from the Senior Leadership Team / Head of Sixth Form.



Bursary Scheme

- We encourage those that may be eligible to submit an application.
- The purpose of the bursary is to address barriers to learning so that students have the best opportunity to engage in Sixth Form life.
- It is designed to help those students in need of financial support whilst they undertake their studies.
- Those eligible for the bursary has increased consistently over the past three years.
- Bursary funds have helped with the start of course costs, student's daily travel costs, school trips, university visits, laptops, books and other resources.






